

USE-OF-TIME ANALYSIS: ALL HOURS








Individual Counseling Topics




I understand the role of the school counselor.


The school counselor helps students develop socially and emotionally.


I feel comfortable consulting and collaborating with the school counselor.


The school counselor provides important services to the students at our school.




My students benefited from the counseling class lessons.

Summary of strengths of the school counseling program:

Staff who completed the survey shared that kids are excited to see the counselor and feel comfortable meeting with the counselor. Additionally, the counselor develops and utilizes resources and programs that are beneficial to students. Furthermore, the counselor communicates well with both staff and parents, is available for students and staff, and works proactively to meet the needs of students. Staff also shared that the counselor listens and collaborates well with others, is aware of student need, and shows compassion and kindness to the students.

Summary of areas of growth of the school counseling program:

Staff who completed the survey shared that students would benefit from more help at the beginning of the year with goal setting and expectations. Additionally, suggestions were made that students (both elementary and jr./sr high) would benefit from more delivery of class lessons and small groups as well as an enrichment period class related to social emotional and academic concerns. Furthermore, several staff felt that additional collaboration and consultation with staff on various topics and strategies would help them assist in meeting the needs of students. Many staff members also stated that an additional counselor in the district would help meet the social emotional and mental health needs of all students. Finally, suggestions were made regarding implementing school wide initiatives in both buildings, and bringing students from the jr./sr. high to the elementary building to serve as a leader/mentor for students during various activities.
